Short title	The Asia Pacific Greens Federation call on ASEAN to set measurable and meaningful targets for reducing emissions in their member countries.
Proposed Resolution Text (about 3 points)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. We call on ASEAN to set measurable and meaningful targets for reducing emissions in member countries in order to contribute their fair share to limit global warming to 1.5 to 2 degrees Celsius. 2. We recognise the huge economic opportunities that come from implementing ambitious targets to reduce greenhouse gas pollution and the huge economic damage that will be inflicted on member countries from not taking action. 3. The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) believes environmental sustainability can be achieved through more intra-regional trade, and switching to LED lighting. ASEAN leaders call their LED policy "ambitious commitment" to greening our community, the Asia Pacific Greens Federation (APGF) say that it is "not good enough."
