Short title	Asia Pacific Greens Federation calls for the smooth phase out of nuclear energy.
Proposed Resolution Text (about 3 points)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Even after 4 years have passed since Fukushima, we recognize that the situation is still in serious danger and out of control; though Japanese government insists that it is “under control”.</li> <li>2. Even though we have paid a whole lot more, some countries in our region seem not to have learned any lesson from the worst-ever nuclear disaster, operating existent nuclear power plants, planning to build new ones, mining uranium and exporting, and looking for inadequate places to dispose of nuclear wastes and so on, which means everything seems to be the same as before Fukushima.</li> <li>3. Here in New Zealand we are meeting where there is no nuclear power or uranium mining. More than 70% of on-grid electricity is supplied from renewable energy and they stay out of nuclear cycle. We should learn from them.</li> </ol>
